THE STORY

In this variation of the beloved fairy tale *Cendrillon*, *La Cenerentola* tells the story of a young woman who is forced to act as a servant to her pompous and mean social-climbing stepfather and ungrateful stepsisters.

When she and the prince (disguised as a servant) meet, it is love at first sight. Along the way from servant to princess, Cenerentola overcomes many obstacles with pluck and courage. And even though her family has been cruel, the resilient Cinderella forgives them and finds happiness with her new husband.

THE MUSIC

This opera is considered to be one of Gioachino Rossini's greatest operatic achievements. It features some of his finest writing for solo voice and ensembles. The music is tuneful, lighthearted, and spirited.

THE ARTISTS

In her mainstage debut, multi-genre artist Winnipeg mezzo-soprano **Lizzy Hoyt** will sing the role of Cenerentola. Juno Award-winning Canadian tenor **John Tessier** returns to the MO stage as the prince, Don Ramiro, and the gifted comic actor **Peter McGillivray** will sing the role of the pompous stepfather Don Magnifico. Winnipeg-based soprano **Andrea Lett** and mezzo-soprano **Adanya Dunn**, making her MO debut, will be singing the roles of stepsisters Clorinda and Tisbe, respectively.

American bass **Kirk Eichelberger** will the trusted advisor to the prince, Alidoro, and baritone **Nicholas Borg** rounds out the cast as Dandini, the prince's valet. Borg was a participant in the company's 2020 Digital Emerging Artists Program. The production will be conducted by **Tyrone Paterson** with the **Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra** and members of the **Manitoba Opera Chorus**.
